

Loudoun County Fair – 2008 Swine Club Rules

1. To exhibit and show at the Loudoun County Fair the exhibitor must have attended 50% of the Swine Club meetings throughout the year.
2. The swine to be exhibited must be owned and personally cared for by the exhibitor 60 days prior to the opening day of the Loudoun County Fair in order to be eligible to show at the Fair.
3. When you are in the show or sale ring you must be wearing the appropriate attire. You must wear boots, clean jeans or nice pants, and either your club shirt or a nice shirt.
4. Market hogs must grade U.S. No. 2 or higher to be sold in the sale.
5. Market hogs must weigh between 210 (minimum weight) and 280 pounds.
6. Hogs exhibited at shows prior to the Loudoun County Fair must have blood tests performed and a health certificate issued by a veterinarian.
7. Only water will be allowed on the hogs for showing.
8. Only 2 hogs per exhibitor; one may be sold in the auction.
9. Premiums will be withheld if hogs are not properly taken care of (watered, fed, pens cleaned).
10. All feed pans and water pans must be removed after feeding.
11. Each Swine Club member will be encouraged to make a presentation at a club meeting on a related topic.
12. Loudoun 4-H'ers or FFA members enrolled in the Market Swine project must own their animal by May 1. All market hogs must be weighed in at the Fairgrounds on the following Saturday. All animals will be tagged at the weigh-in.
13. All hogs will be weighed only one (1) time at fair weigh-in.
14. Hogs must weigh 220 pounds to be eligible for carcass contest
